Three Pillars of Digital Citizenship	
 <p>How we protect ourselves</p>	DIGITAL LITERACY Those who are literate in the online world are better prepared to avoid risky situations, make better-informed decisions, and better understand how to maintain their privacy.
 <p>How we protect each other</p>	DIGITAL CIVILITY Internet users should demonstrate respect for others—behaving with civility and being protective of everyone's rights (their own included). They should learn and apply the skills to behave ethically and within online social norms.
 <p>How we protect our content</p>	INFORMATION LITERACY Information literacy is the ability to identify, locate, evaluate, and effectively use information from the Internet to complete a task, answer a question, or research a topic.
